



# **UBC** Faculty of Arts



- Arts Academic Advising office is responsible for academic advising, evaluation, graduation adjudication.
- 12, 000 students
- Arts Academic Advising in crisis
- Dean recommended a review of the advising office
- One year secondment of Director, Arts Academic Advising



# **Enrolment Services and Degree Audit History**



- Purchased degree audit from Decision Academics based on recommendation by Faculty
- Centrally maintained
- From 1 to 3 full time staff
- Implemented for:
  - UBC Okanagan, Pharmacy, Forestry, Land and Food Systems, Nursing, Commerce, Applied Science and Arts



# Challenges to Implementation



- Fear of the unknown
  - Unknown impact on resources
  - Unknown student response
- Resistance to change
  - Fear of replacing me
- Learning Curve
  - New software
  - New business procedure



# The Arts Project Plan


- Formalized project plan

#### **Arts Students Who Can Use DN4**




#### **DN** Availability for Arts Students




- 1st/2nd year

# Total # of unique visitors per month (for the period of Nov.'05-May'06)




# **Next Steps**

- DN highlights problems to students
- Graduation Adjudication from 3 weeks to 1
- Raised our awareness as service provider
- Opportunity for collaboration amongst advisor
